At a meeting of the Village Board of the Village of Hancock, held at Hancock Village Hall, 85 East Front Street, Hancock, New York on the 12th day of August, 2019, the following resolution was offered and seconded:

WHEREAS, the Village of Hancock scheduled a public hearing for August 12, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. for Local Law No. 1 of the Year 2019 entitled "A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 109 OF THE VILLAGE CODE PERTAINING TO WATER METERS"; and

**WHEREAS**, notice of said public hearing was duly advertised in the official newspaper of the Village and posted on the Village Clerk's signboard; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held at Hancock Village Hall, 85 East Front Street, Hancock, New York at 7:00 p.m. on the 12th day of August, 2019, and all parties in attendance were permitted an opportunity to speak on behalf of or in opposition to said proposed Local Law, or any part thereof; and

WHEREAS, that pursuant to Part 617 of the implementing regulations of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, it has been determined by the Village Board that adoption of the proposed Local Law constitutes an Unlisted Action, as defined under said regulations. The Village Board has considered the possible environmental impacts of the Local Law. The adoption of said Local Law will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment and the Village Board adopts a negative declaration with respect to the Local Law; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Board, after due deliberation, finds it in the best interest of the Village to adopt said Local Law.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Village Board hereby adopts said local law as Local Law No. 1 of the Year 2019 entitled "A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 109 OF THE VILLAGE CODE PERTAINING TO WATER METERS"; and

**RESOLVED** that the Village Clerk be and hereby is directed to enter said Local Law in the minutes of this meeting and to give due notice of the adoption of said Local Law to the Secretary of State; and

**RESOLVED** that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Department of State.

William Brown of Delaware Engineering was present to report on the progress of the installation of the water/sewer meters. Approximately 250 meters have been installed, another 80 are currently scheduled leaving 100-120 not yet scheduled for installation. In reference to the overall water project, the surveying has been completed, paint samples from the water tank have been taken and are being tested for lead. Mr. Brown hopes for state approval and to put the project out to bid by the end of the year.

Mr. Brown also reported that the CDBG grant application for upgrades to the Waste Water Treatment Plant has been submitted by Blauer Associates. Award announcement should be made in December.
